**Teaching Assistant Consultant (TAC) Fellows:** Graduate students trained to provide peer consultation and engage in educational development.

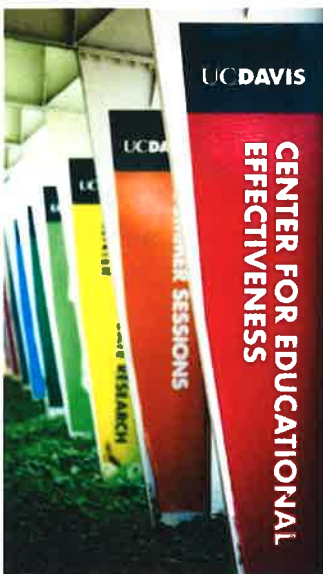
