- 45th Year
- 5,600 current AAP members (enrolled now)
- Over 53,000 members have graduated from UCLA

AAP Diversity

- * Approximately 63% of AAP students are from historically underrepresented backgrounds (Hispanic/Latino, African American, and Native American).
- * Approximately 51% of AAP students are the first in their family to attend college.
- * Approximately 22% of UCLA undergraduates are AAP members.
- * AAP graduates the highest percentage of historically underrepresented students in the UC system, the CSU system, and among major public research universities in the country.
- * AAP has been recognized as one of the "most creative, successful, and innovative" student retention programs in the country.

- 7-week intensive residential program
- Cohort model (300 FR, 200 TR)











Freshman & Transfer Summer Programs (F/TSP)

- * AAP's F/TSP program is a seven-week rigorous academic residential program that introduces and prepares students for the academic demands of UCLA. Scholars:
 - Become familiar with campus programs, resources and research opportunities.
 - * Earn 10-13 units toward degree and have the opportunity to become part of Honors Program.
 - * Receive Full and Partial Scholarships.
